

FACTS ABOUT THE ACTS - CANADA



INTERPRETATION ACT - R.S.C., 1985, C. I-21 CANADA

Canada, for greater certainty, includes the internal waters of Canada and the territorial sea of Canada; (Canada)

INTERPRETATION ACT - INTERNAL WATERS

IA) in relation to Canada, means the internal waters of Canada as determined under the Oceans Act and includes the airspace above and the bed and subsoil below those waters, and
b) in relation to any other state, means the waters on the landward side of the baselines of the territorial sea of the other state; (eaux intérieures)

OCEANS ACT - INTERNAL WATERS OF CANADA S.C. 1996, C. 31 (SECTION 6)

6 The internal waters of Canada consist of the waters on the landward side of the baselines of the territorial sea of Canada.

APPLICATION OF PROVINCIAL LAW OCEANS ACT - S.C. 1996, C. 31 (SECTION 9)

9 (1) Subject to this section and to any other Act of Parliament, the laws of a province apply in any area of the sea
(a) that forms part of the internal waters of Canada or the territorial sea of Canada;

RIGHTS OF HER MAJESTY OCEANS ACT - S.C. 1996, C. 31 (SECTION 8)

8 (1) For greater certainty, in any area of the sea not within a province, the seabed and subsoil below the internal waters of Canada and the territorial sea of Canada are vested in Her Majesty in right of Canada.
